

Results of Education Survey CHICA Canada NB-PEI Chapter

Background

Ongoing professional development that meets the needs of Infection Prevention and Control Professionals (ICPs) and personnel with designated responsibilities for infection prevention and control is not usually available within facilities. The number of target personnel is small and expertise is limited. In-services directed to ICPs are not readily available; most likely ICPs are delivering education regarding infection prevention and control not receiving it.

Professional development opportunities are further limited secondary to recent fiscal constraints. Therefore the Executive is planning for regular education sessions to be associated with our Chapter meetings. To assist with planning Chapter members were asked at the May meeting to complete and return a simple education needs assessment survey.

Analysis

A list of topics related to the practice of infection prevention and control was provided and members were asked to rank the items in order of importance to them. A total of 24 members responded returning 22 surveys (one survey was returned for 2 members twice):

- 12 acute care
- 8 long term care
- 3 acute and long term care
- 1 unable to determine origin

Not all participants ranked every topic. The experience of the participants ranged from novice to expert.

The results were collated and each topic was ranked by the number of participants who included it in their top 5 priorities for education. Five topics (see Table 1) were ranked in the top 5 by 50% or more of those responding to that topic.

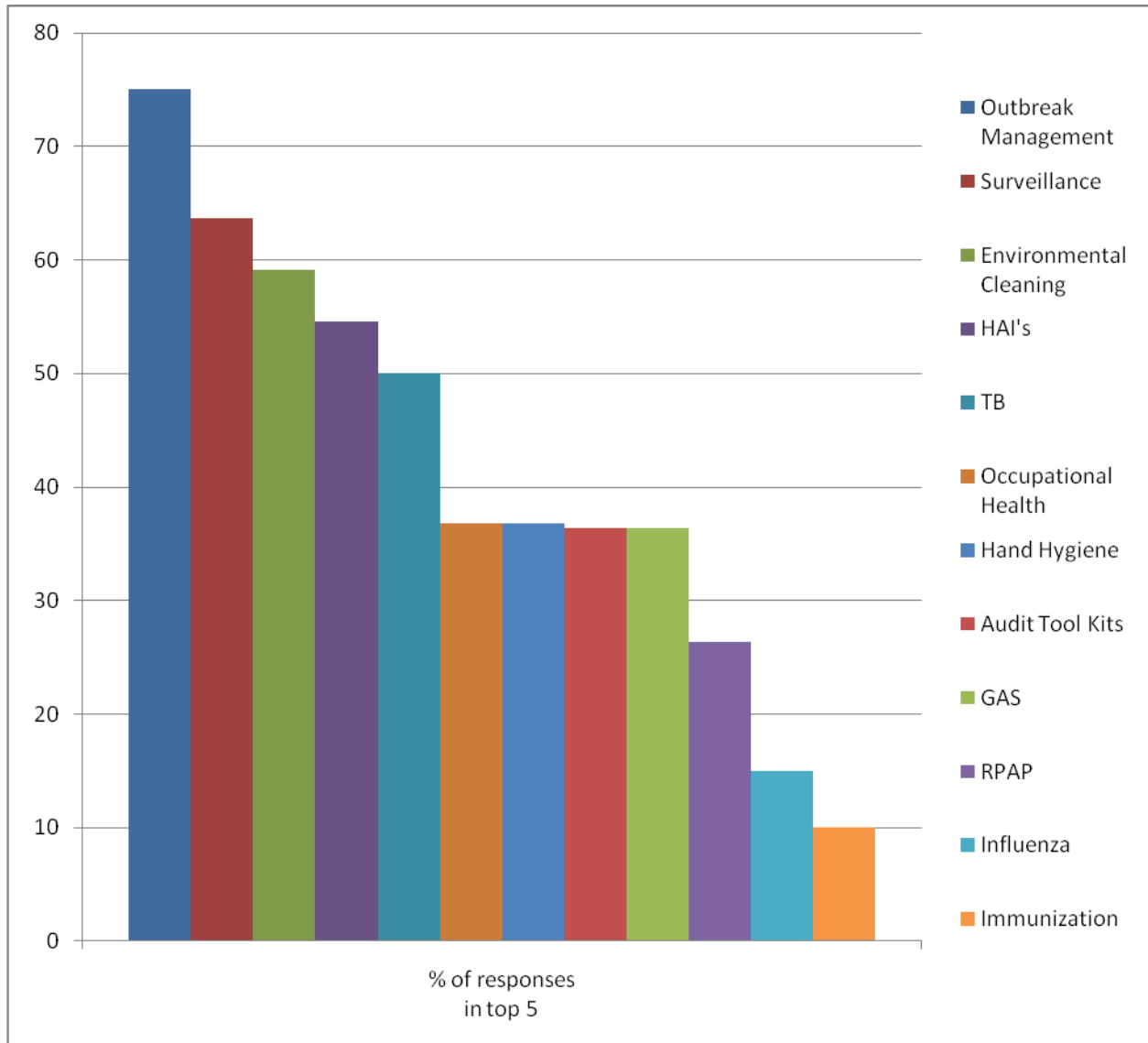

Outbreak Management	75%
Surveillance	64%
Environmental Cleaning	59%
Healthcare Associated Infections (HAIs)	55%
TB	50%

Chart 1 presents the percentage of responders for each topic who ranked it in categories 1 to 5 for all the categories.

Each topic is ranked by the percentage of responders who included the topic in their top five picks



Eight additional topics were suggested by the membership. Of significance, 7 members (29.1% of those who responded to the survey) suggested sterilization and reprocessing as a topic of need. Not enough to be in the top 5, but it would rank 10th in the top 10 topics. The suggested topics are presented in Table 2.

Clearly the topics of greatest need for our membership are Outbreak Management, Surveillance, Environmental Cleaning, Healthcare Associated Infections, and Tuberculosis. Some members are knowledgeable and experienced in these topics, but many are not.

Further detail must be elicited from the membership to focus the education efforts on these topics. Some education can be delivered formally after chapter business meetings and some more informally via email and NB/PEI Chapter website (soon to be up and running).
